

Rules, rules, rules......

A player hit his drive to the right of the fairway into the first cut of rough. By the time he reached his ball a grounds keeper was approaching on a mower on a path in line with his ball. As a convenience for the mower, the player picked up his ball and waved the mower through. He then replaced the ball and played on. Were there any rules violated?

At least two rules were violated. First, he did not mark his ball before lifting it. Second, he did not announce to his fellow players his intention of lifting the ball. Had he cleaned his ball after lifting, that would have been a third. Each of these is one stroke. Fourth, he allowed his lie to be improved by the mower which cut the rough to a shorter and cleaner length.

So, what is his penalty? Is it the sum of all the violations? Four strokes seems a bit excessive. Rule 1-4/5 provides that if a player breaches two rules with different penalties, the more severe penalty is applied. In this case, the more severe penalty is improving his lie which is two strokes.
